MRS. PLANT

The Jewish Center has a central intake procedure. Mrs. Camille M. Plant handles all Nursery and Camp Centerland applications. Mrs. Plant interviews all membership scholarship applicants, as well as all who apply for adjusted fees. Mrs. Plant is available by appointment to discuss adjusted fee for Center Services.

MEETING ROOMS

VOLUNTEER SERVICES

The Jewish Center utilizes a corps of trained leaders in planning and servicing its program. Opportunities for paid and volunteer service on all levels—Nursery to Golden Age—are available. Morris Siegel, Group Work Supervisor of the Jewish Center, co-ordinates all training and recruitment. Mr. Siegel is available at all times to meet with interested Adults and Young Adults concerning leadership openings. Training sessions for leaders will be offered this season, as will individual consultations. Contact Mr. Siegel, or any professional staff member, for full details.

INFORMATION DESK

The receptionist has complete information in regard to scheduling, can make arrangements for interviews with staff, accept dues payments and answer other information.

STAFF OFFICES

The Administration Offices and the Health and Physical Education Office, are located on the main floor. All Program Department offices are on the second floor, as are those of the Bureau of Jewish Education and the Hebrew Benevolent Loan Association.

CHECK ROOM

A check room is maintained on the first floor gratis. The Center cannot assume responsibility for items checked unless a checkroom attendant is on duty and unless a check stub is issued.

PARKING

For your convenience, the Center parking lot east of the building will accommodate over 75 cars. Members are requested to observe the following regulations adopted for the benefit and safety of all:

"Automobiles should be parked only in marked areas in such manner as not to interfere with the further parking of cars or in the driveways or in way of cars already parked. Automobiles will not be permitted to stand in the driveways, but must be parked in the places designated by the House Committee".

Members are reminded that the parking lot will be closed at midnight except for special affairs and that no overnight parking will be permitted.

The American Red Cross, located directly across Delaware Avenue from the Center, has generously extended its parking privileges to organizational members meeting at the Center, provided the Red Cross is notified by the Center in advance that a large group is meeting and will need the additional area for parking. Organization presidents should contact Mr. Grossman in advance of their meeting so he can make arrangements with the Red Cross for either afternoon or evening meetings.

COMMUNITY LIBRARY

The Bureau of Jewish Education maintains a Jewish Community Library on the second floor of the Jewish Center Building. The library includes both reference and circulating books in English, Hebrew and Yiddish.

A complete file of current and back issues of Jewish magazines is available for use in the library. The library is open week day evenings from 7:30-9:30 P.M. and is available free of charge to the public.

PAYMENT OF MEMBERSHIP FEES
