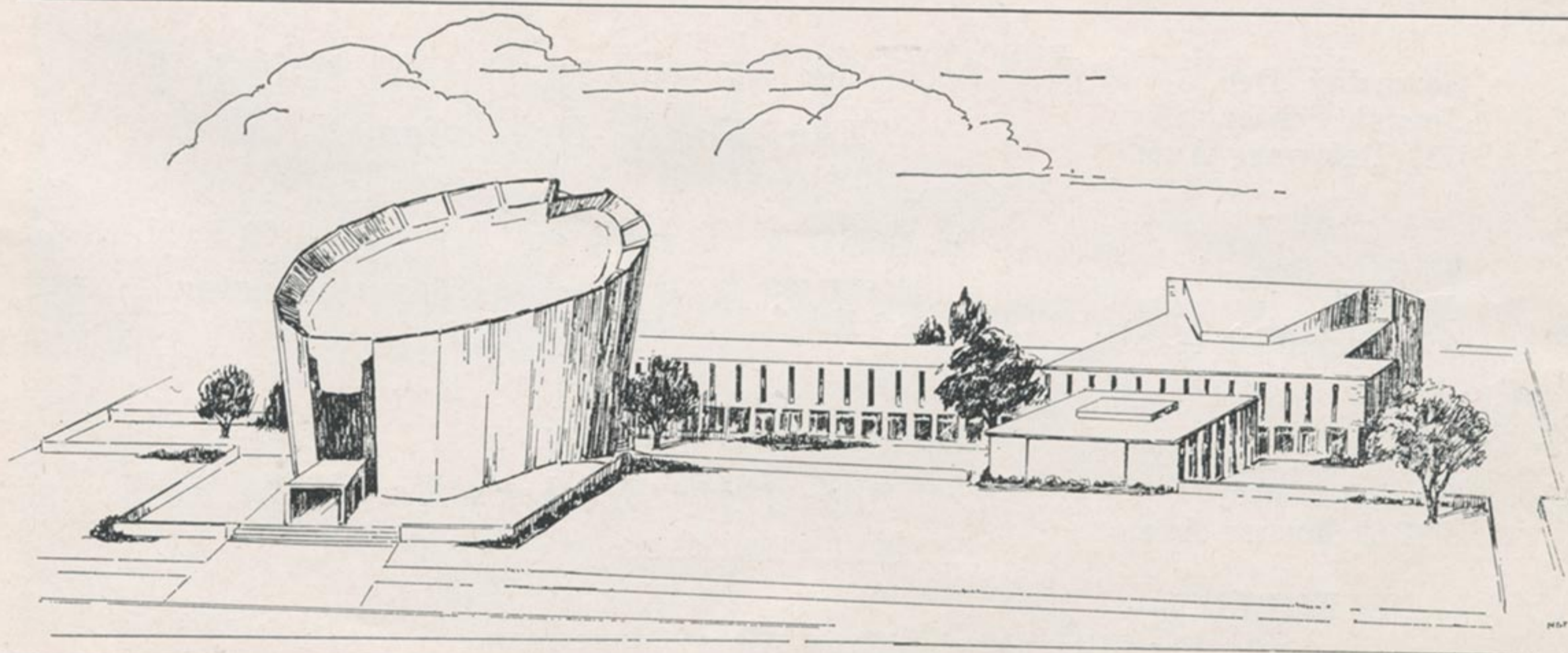

## *From the Rabbis' Study*

This year the festival of Chanukah began during the month of November and closer to Thanksgiving Day than ever before. These festivals have much in common. Each commemorates the heroism of a small but dedicated group which was determined to survive against overwhelming obstacles. Each, also, is an attempt to thank God for the victory of the spirit and to serve as a reminder of the presence of God in our lives and in the world.

Chanukah carries further implication as well. Although it is considered a minor festival in the cycle of Jewish religious observances, the primary idea that it represents is an important one. It is dedicated to the important concept of religious freedom and a call to rededicate ourselves to our religious ideals. It is hoped that the spirit of Chanukah with its theme of rededication will pervade our homes this year, while its message of religious freedom is emphasized during our Chanukah Candlelighting Family Service on December 4. I hope you will be able to attend and participate in this beautiful and meaningful service.

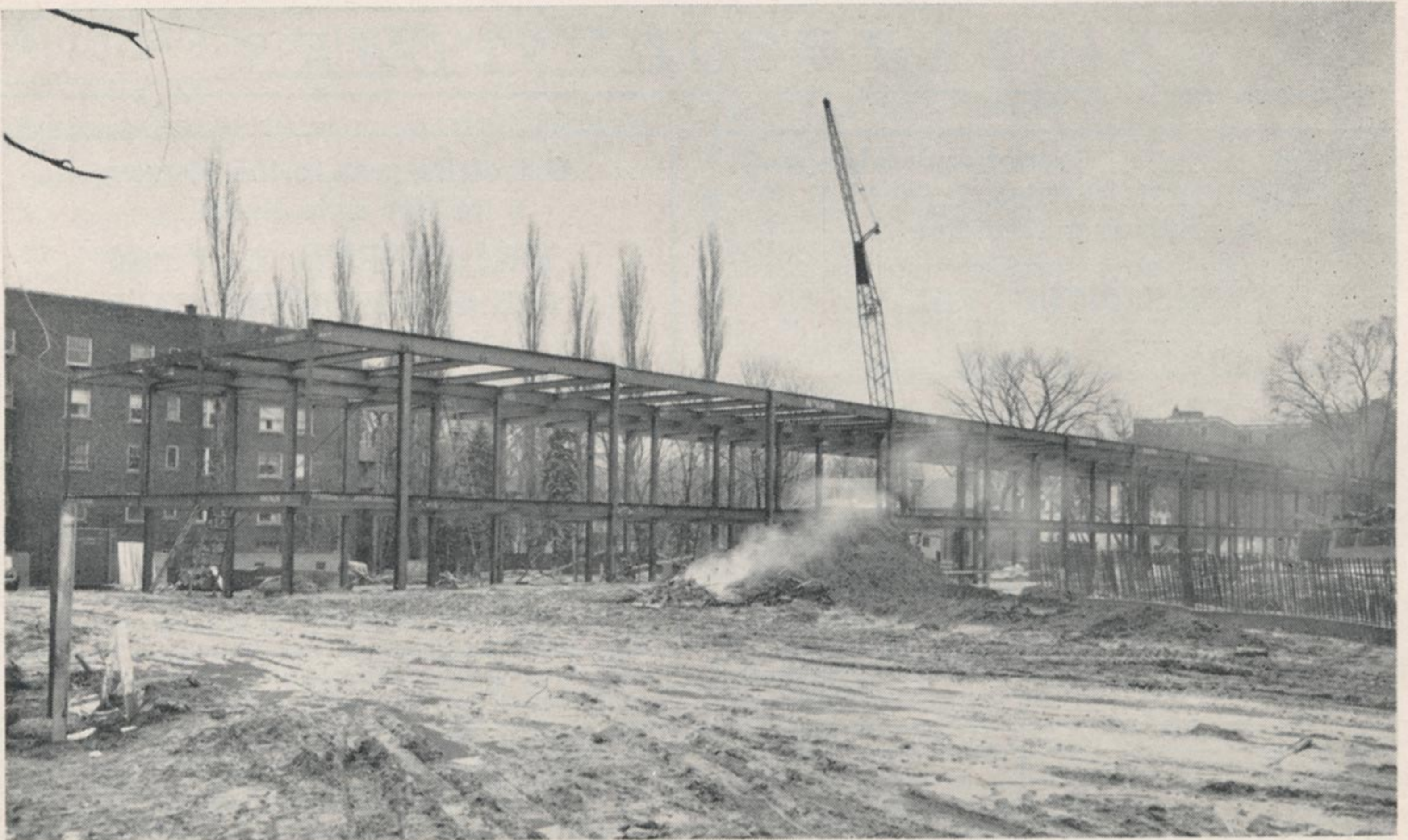
## **ATTENTION! YOUNG MARRIEDS**

A number of young married couples met with Rabbi Arnold I. Sher on Friday, Nov. 20 following Temple Services, to organize and initiate a program of study that would be relevant to their position in the Temple, the community, the nation, and the world. This group felt that a need existed to examine the religious concepts which would help clarify the role of the individual Jew in modern society. It was the general consensus of the group to embark upon a study program by examining some of the "basic principles" of Reform Judaism. The group anticipates a wide and varied program which would include: volunteer work at local community service agencies; concrete activities which would promote and further the civil rights movement; special discussions dealing with family life, child-rearing and education; and creative worship services.

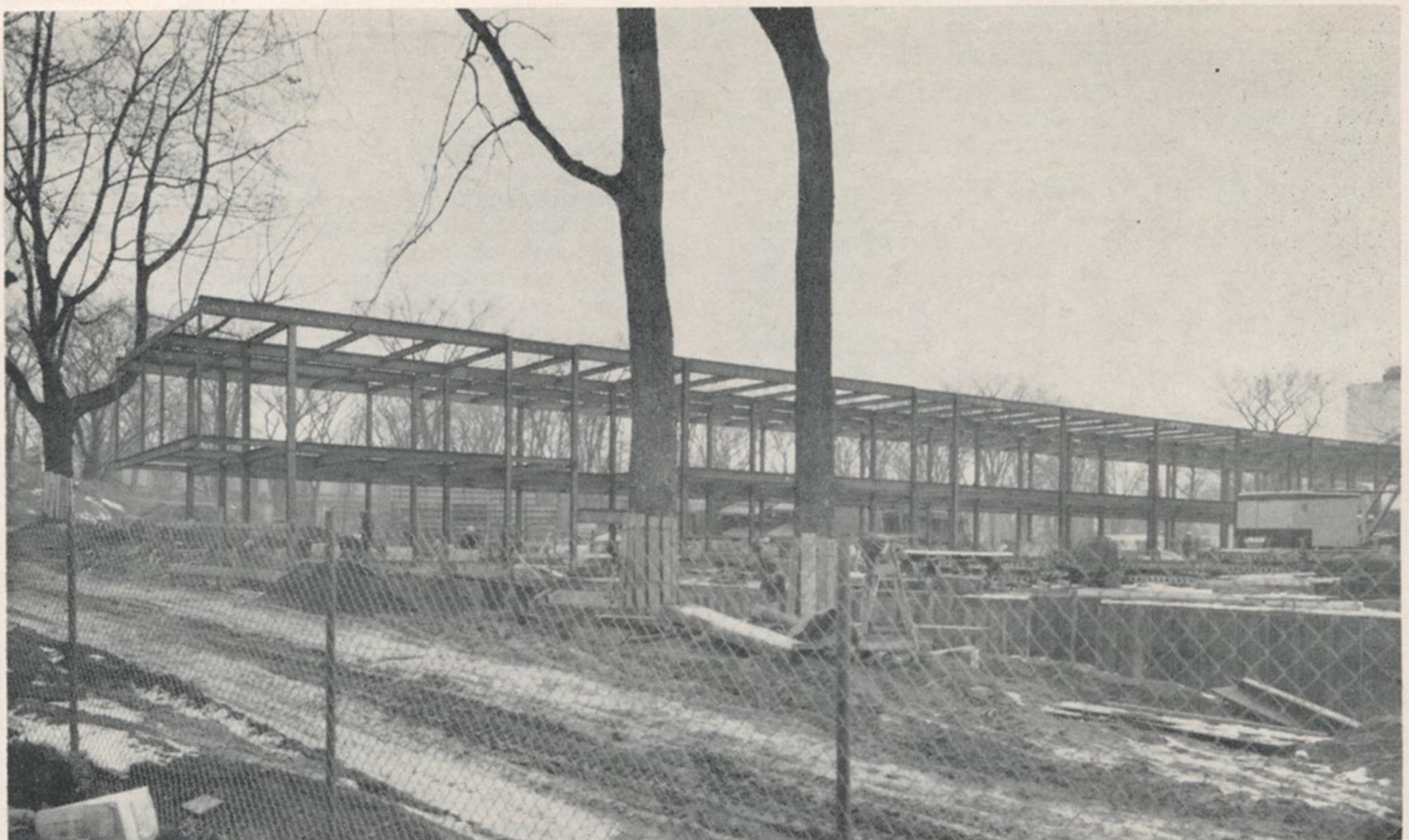

## RELIGIOUS SCHOOL NEWS

### Religious School Calendar—Winter Vacation

### Three Fold Objective for the Religious School Teacher

The religious school teacher has a three-fold objective—he must try to teach so that affective, objective, and intellectual learning are achieved by the children. Briefly, objective learning includes the study of history, festivals, Bible, literature, and certain Jewish skills such as prayers, and Hebrew. The material is essentially factual, drawn together by theories and concepts. Objective learning can be tested—the child either knows the material or he does not. Affective learning, on the other hand, involves the learning of attitudes, emotional responses, and empathies. Affective learning can never be concretely tested, for the cause of the attitude change or development can never be pinpointed. Intellectual learning can be defined as the learning of critical or creative thinking. This third kind of learning is essential for a development of a liberal religious point of view. Intellectual learning can be tested by measuring the development of the analysis one employs in coming to terms with a problem.

So, the effective religious school teacher must, (1) be an individual who has positive personality, who can stimulate and encourage youth by the very nature of his personality and who stands as a living testimony of much of what we wish our children to be; (2) the religious school teacher should be competent in the field of Jewish sources so that objective learning can be accomplished; and (3) the religious school teacher should be of a liberal-thinking frame of mind to help nurture questioning and logical religious thought.

These three areas of teaching—objective, affective, intellectual—are never separated in the minds of the students. Often the child's attitude toward Judaism and the school, determines how much objective learning will be achieved.

Conversely, objective knowledge often helps change attitudes as certain pre-conceived prejudices are dissipated. And as an extension of this, intellectual skills cannot be attained unless there exists a positive attitude toward individual thinking and an adequate basis of factual material readily at hand.

The goals of the religious school teacher are difficult ones, but if the parents act as co-workers with the school, the teacher's effectiveness will be greatly enhanced. Support positive attitudes, reinforce factual material learned, stimulate curiosity and critical analysis. Of course, always remember that the five year old is not a ten year old. With gentle guidance, the child will develop, and, at the proper state of his development, he will ask the religious questions which should be asked.

**THE ETERNAL SEARCH**

The Bible nowhere calls upon men to go out in search of peace of mind. It does call upon men to go out in search of God and the things of God. There is a lyrical vibrancy to such moments when man drinks of the wine of life and partakes of the very manna of heaven.

Personal sacrifices are often involved in the pursuit of the good life. Sometimes even martyrdom is called for . . . True love of God is to serve Him "with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your might" (Deuteronomy 6:5). Akiba defined the term "with all your soul" to mean "even if He takes away your life." He attested it with his own martyrdom.
