SOMETHING NEW HAS BEEN ADDED!

Like my granddaughters who eat around the cake and leave the frosting for last, I have kept this particular bit of news as the final item of interest for this month.

Unlike a half century ago, when 98% of the residents of the Rosa Coplon Jewish Home and Infirmary spoke no other language but Yiddish, now about 2% will resort to Yiddish among themselves, only when groping for an illusive translation of a word or phrase. At one time, the Women's League supplied the residents with twelve subscriptions to Yiddish papers. At present about a third of the subscriptions suffice. They rely on TV and English papers for daily news. Yet when you speak to these people and questions - "Where did you learn to speak Yiddish?" "Were you bern in the Old Country.?" "How nice!"

It was because of the thoughtful suggestion of Patricia McCormick, Activities Director of the HOME that efforts are being made to revive Yiddish. Although Pat is not Jewish, her involvement with the residents is keeping serve to their needs and interests and she feels that this outlet will asked Mrs. Bea Leib, president of the Women's League, who has an excellent command of the Yiddish language and is an all-around knowledgeable person, not too successful, but those who attended were enthused, interested and are anticipating the next session to challenge all newcomers.
